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Thank you for opening your heart and home to an orphaned animal. Listed below are regulations set forth by A Different Breed (ADB) regarding our foster program.

- 1. Foster animals are considered the custody of ADB until adopted.
- 2. If you are unable to continue fostering ADB must be given 30 days notice to make appropriate arrangements. If this situation arises, the fostered animal may not be taken to other shelters, given away, or passed on to friends or family without permission of ADB.
- The foster parent is responsible for non-veterinary expense, such as food and litter.
- 4. Any medical expenses must be approved in advance by an ADB representative, this means before being incurred. Once approved, veterinary expense reimbursement will require copies of bills for charges attributed to the fostered animal. ADB is not responsible for medical or other expense by the foster parent's other pets while fostering an ADB animal.
- 5. ADB foster animals will have received the following care, depending upon age:

Vaccinations: Dogs & Cats: Rabies vaccination

Dogs: DHLP/Corona/Bordetella

Cats: FVRCP/FeLV

Testing:

Dogs: Heartworm

De-worming: Dogs & Cats

Sterilization: Dogs & Cats

- 6. ADB will provide heartworm preventative and flea/tick control.
- 7. Cats must be kept indoors at all times.
- 8. Dogs may be indoor/outdoor during the day provided they have shelter, food, water, and proper fencing. Dogs must be kept indoors at night.

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I/we understand that A Different Breed (ADB) does its best to evaluate a pet's temperament and behavior. I will not hold ADB liable for any damage the animal does while in my care. ADB is concerned about the health of the animals and exercises due caution to prevent the transmission of diseases. Unless you are notified otherwise, the animal(s) you foster will have been given preventative immunizations. However, because of the dire circumstances from which many of the rescue animals come, any animal may carry or could have already been exposed to an infectious disease, which may not be apparent for several days; therefore ADB cannot warrant or guarantee the foster pet is healthy or good-natured. Any animal has the potential to bite or cause injury. You have determined for yourself the animal is acceptable for you and your household to foster, and you agree to indemnify and hold ADB, ADB volunteers, and other ADB representatives harmless for any illness the animal may develop and any injury or damage this foster pet may cause once you have taken possession of the animal.
